

Eagles Whip Smyrna; G. Willis Hits 63 Points

Knights Trample Jets, 125-25

Queen Street's Knights rolled up their biggest score in history Thursday night at W. S. King School Gym as they trampled the visiting Fort Bragg Jets, 125-25.

The contest was most one-sided since the Knights had the advantage in height and manpower. The Jets were only able to bring five players to the game, and they were too small to cope with the big boys of Coach Shad Barrow.

The Knights moved out to a 31-4 lead at the end of the first stanza and extended the advantage to 59-9 at halftime. At the end of three quarters the Knights led 101-15, and they finished up with a 125-25 decision.

Six players hit for double figures for the Knights with high scoring honors going to Luther Tootle with 21 points. Lathen Windley tallied 20, Linwood Davis and Joe George 18, Tyrone Ellison 16 and Joe Pasteur 15.

J. Henry was high for the Jets with 8 markers as Thwreatt scored 6.

Knights, Trenton Split Twin-Bill

Queen Street's Knights split a doubleheader with the Trenton teams Friday night at the W. S. King Gym, winning the feature contest 50-40 and dropping the prelim, 42-23.

The boys contest saw the Knights move out to a 12-5 lead at the end of the first quarter and they extended the advantage to 24-11 at halftime. At the end of the third quarter, Queen Street led 37-27 and were never headed.

High scoring honors for the winners went to Lathen Windley with 13 points as teammates Joe Pasteur 12, and Luther Tootle 10, also hit for double figures.

The preliminary contest saw the Trenton sextet take a 10-5 lead at the end of the initial stanza and extend the advantage to 19-14 at halftime. At the end of the third canto Trenton led 30-19 and the outcome was never in doubt.

M. Brown led the Trenton girls with 26 points as Melissa Harkley scored 15 for the Queen Street team.

High scorers for Trenton in the feature game were Jones with 13 markers and Kornegay with 12.

Morehead City's Eagles tied for first place in the Seashore Conference Friday night at the home court as they swamped Smyrna 69-46.

Gladys Willis's 63 points setting a new county record helped pace the Smyrna girls team to an 82-71 victory in the prelim.
