# FIFTY YEARS AGO

David Pearce Willis, administrator of Allendale County Hospital, Fairfax, S.C., will succeed Hoyle Greene, who has accepted a position in Dunn, as administrator of Morehead City Hospital. Charles F. Caudell Jr., with Chicago Pharmacal Co., will become administrator of Sea Level Community Hospital, succeeding Marshall Whisnant, who has accepted a position in Kingsport, Tenn.

County commissioners have suggested that the county airport commission erect no trespassing signs at the county airport to discourage "hot-rodders" from using the air strip as a race track. Sheriff Hugh Salter said he will make every effort to enforce the regulation.

### TEN YEARS AGO

An estimated 9,500 persons attended the 8th Annual Core Sound Decoy Festival over the weekend at Harkers Island Elementary School and the Core Sound Waterfowl Museum.

Morehead City Councilmen have approved a rezoning request clearing the way for the N.C. State Univeristy Center for Marine Sciences and Technology (CMAST), a 25,000-square foot major marine science research facility on the campus of Carteret Community College, a joint venture between the university, community college and the UNC Institute of Marine Sciences.

First Citizens has opened its 8,514-square foot, \$1.4 million main office at 35<sup>th</sup> and Bridges Street, Morehead City.

Widening of Highway 24 from Hibbs Road to Morehead City is under way with grading and prep work and the relocation of waterlines. The \$6.2 million project is expected to be finished in a year.
