The Newport Hawks racked up their third victory of the year Tuesday night at Newport. They shellacked a visiting White Oak team by an 81-56 margin. The Hawks drubbed White Oak by a 62-22 score in their opening game this year. They took a 79-62 victory over Atlantic in their second game.

Johnny Mason and Larry Wallace sparked the Newport attack with 18 and 17 points respectively. Yancey of White Oak, however, was the high scorer of the game with 27 points.

The Hawks reared into a 25-11 lead in the first quarter and continued to build their lead throughout the game. They had a comfortable 44-28 lead at the half.

The Newport starters accounted for 65 points with subs scoring the other 16 markers. Nine Hawks broke into the scoring column. Trailing Mason and Wallace in the scoring figures were Reuben Lilly, 15, Alton Hardison, 11, Woody Barnes, 6, Billy Wade, 4, Joe Mann, 4, Larry Kirk, 3, and Ronnie Edwards, 2.

While this year's edition of the Hawks lacks some of the polish of last year's county champs, they more than make it up in hustle and spirit. Only Mason and Hardison played with last season's first team, which included Deryn Temple, Leston Gillikin and Gilbert Garner.
