# AC Reverses Direction; Owns 3-Game Win Streak

The Atlantic Christian College Bulldogs are finally living up to Coach Jim Pfohl's pre-season praise.

Pfohl, who sincerely felt his club was his best ever and would have a better - than - average season, struggled through the first six games with a 1-5 record. Then AC upset powerhouse Guilford, 3-1, and the youthful Bulldog boss made another prediction: "This is what we needed," he said after the victory. "We'll start rolling now."

That bit of soothsaying has turned out to be fact, at least for the moment. The Bulldogs extended the Guilford win to a three-game winning streak at Newberry, S. C., Saturday by knocking down Newberry twice, 4-3 and 4-1, behind the superb four-hit pitching of Charlie Stovall and Ronnie Johnson and some timely hitting.

"We hit better Saturday," noted Pfohl. "than we have at any time this season. I think our hitters are beginning to gain some confidence."

AC cracked 17 hits in sweeping the doubleheader. Watt Moore, a junior center fielder, led the parade with four hits. Another good day came from left fielder Ed Carraway, who started for the first time this season and supplied three hits and two stolen bases. Right

fielder Rick Arrington and third baseman Chuck Fleet also had three hits each.

Concerning the pitching, Pfohl commented, "We got two well pitched games, especially Stovall's performance. Ronnie Johnson was effective, but he's still having some trouble with his control. His wildness hasn't hurt him much yet, but it will against some of the better teams in the conference."

Newberry can't be classified with the best in the Carolinas Conference. The Indians are 1-10, all in league play. The victories, of course, improved AC's over-all mark to 4-5 and its Carolinas Conference record to a fine 3-1.

The Bulldogs get a chance to make that record 4-1 in the conference and pull even in all games as they host conference opponent Elon College at Fleming Stadium Wednesday. Game time is 2:30 p.m.

Getting back to the New-

berry twin bill, Ronnie Johnson not only hurled his first win, but the former Louisburg Junior College star also stroked the game-winning hit when he singled in two runs in the top of the sixth inning. His blow put AC ahead 4-1. AC's other runs came on Arrington's RBI-single in the third and Moore's run-scoring double in the fifth.

In the second game, Stovall was tagged for a run in the first inning and then gave up two more hits in the second. The tall senior, however, retired 16 of the last 17 men he faced in winning his first game against two losses.

AC's won it for Stovall with a three-run outburst in the fifth inning. Jerry Waddell walked and was sacrificed to second by Stovall. Moore then stroked single for AC's first run. Fleet followed Moore with another single and both scored on Vic Camechis' double.
