

Salter Path Wins Two To Keep Perfect Record

Salter Path extended its win streak to eight straight games Sunday afternoon with 7-2 and 14-2 victories over Twin Cities. Mel Adcox pitched an eight-hitter in the opener to gain his fifth victory of the year to stay the league's winningest hurler.

Salter Path's big bats went to work in the first inning to give Adcox a three-run cushion to work with. He had a 5-0 lead by the third inning when he allowed Twin Cities their first run.

Salter Path got the run back in the bottom of the third and scored one more in the fourth. Twin Cities scored once more in the fifth inning.

Martin, T. Bass and Brown of Twin Cities collected two hits each for the losers. Brown had a double and a single for his three trips to the plate.

Two for Four

Eugene Haskett was the only Salter Pather to hit safely on more than one occasion. He had two for four. Purcell Jones and Harold Bass got extra-base hits for the winners. Jones got a triple and Bass got a double.

Jarvis Guthrie went the dis-

tance in the second game to gain credit for his second victory. He held Twin Cities to five hits and struck out nine batters.

Jones had a perfect game at the plate with two doubles and a single in three trips. Guthrie, Bass and Lewis added doubles for Salter Path. Brown and Willis hit doubles for Twin Cities.

Gave Up 8 Hits

Losing Pitcher Bobby Martin gave up eight hits and 13 walks in five innings. He walked seven men in the fifth before being relieved by Roberson.

Roberson worked the last two innings and allowed one hit and no runs. He relieved in the fifth inning in the first game and pitched hitless ball for the last two innings.
