MTRG climbed into a third place tie in county baseball standings Sunday afternoon when they hung a pair of defeats on the Coast Guard. The games at Cherry Point left each team with a 5-7 record for the season. Scores were 10-6 and 11-6.

The doubleheader was the second of the weekend for the Marines who split with Twin Cities Friday night under the lights at main post field, Cherry Point. The Marine copped an 8-0 shutout in the opener but lost a 14-9 decision in the nightcap.

Duke Eiduke hurled a two-hitter in the first game against Twin Cities. H. D. Paul and T. C. Bass were the only batters to touch him for hits.

Eiduke started the second game but was knocked from the box and charged with the defeat. Bass and Paul were the big guns in the second game. Bass rapped out two doubles and Paul got a double and a single. Mickie Deitling was the leading batter for MTRG in both games. He got two for four in the first game and two for three in the second game.

Pete Catania pitched the MTRG team to their first victory over the Coast Guard, 10-6. Julius Taylor, with three for four, was the only Guardsman to figure him out for more than one hit. Braxton was charged with the defeat.



Atlantic, winner of 10 straight games, is still on top of the county baseball league. Salter Path is in second place with a 10-2 mark. The two service teams, Coast Guard and MTRG, are tied for third with 5-7 records. Smyrna-III has won two while dropping eight, good for fifth place. Twin Cities has won two in twelve starts.
