managed to score 19. Garner, who
has been averaging more than 12
points per game, is out with the
flu, it was reported. According
to the Hawks' fans, Mr. Lilly
plays a better offensive game
from the outside.

Also scoring for Newport were guard Jimmy Aycock, 16; Ray Avery, 13; Kenny Mann, 10; Skip Johnson, 4; and Mike Joyce, 2.

Smyrna hit 26 of 52 field goal attempts for 50 per cent, and picked up another 22 points from the free-throw line. The Blue Devil defense and an off night made for a poor offensive showing by the Hawks, Newport hit
