

# East All-Stars Take Wi Victory is Third in Row For Eastern All-Stars

The east all-stars edged the west by a one-run, 10-9 margin Sunday afternoon in the annual county baseball league all-star game. The victory was the third straight for the east and gave it a 3-2 edge in the series.

The west jumped on starter Laurie Willis for three quick runs in the top of the first inning. They added two

more in the third to take a five to nothing lead. The east scored in the bottom of the third to get back in the game.

The east got one more in the fourth. The west got the run back in the top of the fifth. In the bottom of the fifth, the east broke loose for four big runs to cut the west's margin to 8-7.

### Cockerham Pitches

East manager Iroy Cockerham ran out of pitchers in the sixth inning. He took the mound himself and held the west to one run in the last three innings. Johnny Willis pitched to the last batter, Wade Willis, since Cockerham had pitched a full three innings before the game was over.

Jarvis Guthrie, who went into the game in the fifth inning, was charged with the loss. The east jumped on his pitches for three runs in the seventh inning to take a 10-8 margin.

### West Rallies

The west rallied for one run in the top of the ninth but was unable to drive across the tying run.

Leading batters for the west were Gherman Guthrie with three singles in five trips to the plate, Eugene Haskett with a single and a triple in six trips, James Hurrings, one for three, and Wade Willis, one for two.

Rodney Smith was the only batter to collect two hits for the east. He had two for four trips to the plate. Jamie Lewis got a double for two trips to the platter.
