Atlantic Stuns Salter Path With 22-6 Decision Sunday

Atlantic batters clubbed five Salter Path hurlers for 19 hits to score 22 runs Sunday afternoon at Atlantic. Salter Path got 6 runs on 13 hits off two Atlantic pitchers.

The game was the first in the final round of play-offs for the county baseball league championship. The second and third games will be played at Salter Path Sunday. If Atlantic wins the second game, the third will not be played.

Atlantic pitcher Thomas Salter started for the home team. Salter Path got to him for two runs on two singles and a walk. Atlantic got into the ball game in the bottom of the same inning.

Score Three Runs

They scored three runs off the slants of Purcell Jones, making his first mound appearance of the year. Jones gave up three more runs in the second and was relieved by Jarvis Guthrie in the third.

Guthrie pitched to two batters and gave up one run before he was removed in favor of Mel Adcox. Adcox gave up five runs in the fifth and five more in the sixth before he was lifted.

Gehrman Guthrie went to the mound in the seventh but in the eighth inning Atlantic got to him and Henry Frost for five more runs to run their total to 22.

Saunders Pitches

After letting Salter pitch the first eight innings, manager Roy Cockerham put Butch Saunders in the game to warm up for next week.

Salter allowed one run in the fifth inning and three in the eighth to account for the rest of Salter Path's runs. Saunders pitched air-tight ball in the ninth for Atlantic.

Three Salter Path batters got three hits each. They were John Campbell, Gehrman Guthrie and Eugene Haskett. None were extra-base hits.

Manager Cockerham accounted

for four of Atlantic's 19 hits. He had a perfect day at the plate with two doubles and two singles in four trips. Al Vaughan hit a triple and two singles in five at bats and Johnny Willis poled a double and two singles in six times up.

Buddy Willis got Atlantic's fifth extra-base hit, a double. John Hamilton, Carroll Willis and Howard Pittman got two singles each.
