The win gave Newport the right to travel to Kenansville Friday night where the Hawks will play the Lenoir county entry.

The Hawks gave evidence early in the game they intended to be the conference champs, as they took a 35-23 half-time lead.

In the third quarter, the Jasper boys started making their bid for the title as they pulled to within a points of the Hawks.

But there was too much ground for the Jasper lads to make up as Newport hung on to their lead and ran out the clock.

Ray Avery was the leading scorer for the Hawks with eight field goals and a single point from the charity line for a total of 17. Teammate Sammy Lilly contributed 15 points for the Hawks' cause.
