

Pud Hassell Hurls 2-Hit Shutout; Seadogs Bombard Hurricanes 17-0

The Beaufort Seadogs combed three Pamlico pitchers for a total of 19 hits Tuesday to score a 17-0 win over the Hurricanes in a game that was called after five innings of play on account of darkness.

Lefthander Pud Hassell hurred the win for the Seadogs, limiting the Hurricanes to only two hits. The classy southpaw struck out nine and walked six on the way to his second victory of the year against no losses.

The Seadogs started early in the game as they worked Hurricane starter Potter for 5 hits and 11 big first inning runs before he could retire the side. Potter was relieved with two out in the first. Truitt and Caton, his successors, blanked the Seadogs until the bottom of the fifth frame when Beaufort scored six runs off Caton.

Pamlico's only hits were a single by Caton in the first inning and another single by Hudson in the fourth.

Parris Croom, with two hits in two trips to the plate, led the Seadog hitting attack along with Chuck Lewis and Johnny Hassell who each collected three safeties in five times at bat. Pud Hassell was credited with three hits in four appearances and Bill Morgan, Ray Hassell, Alton Hill and Leslie Croom each had a pair of hits.

The win was the third straight for the Seadogs. They now have amassed a total of 54 runs in three contests compared to two opponent runs. It was also the second straight shutout turned in by the Seadog hurling staff.

Blue Devils Tally 3 In 6th for 8-7 Win

The Smyrna Blue Devils scored three big runs in the bottom of the sixth inning Tuesday afternoon to erase a Camp Lejeune lead and allow the Blue Devils to score an 8-7 win over the Devil Pups. The win was the fourth in a row for the Blue Devils this year and left their unblemished record intact.

Braxton Piner, who came on in relief of starter Bryon Styron in the sixth, picked up credit for the win as he pitched one and two-thirds innings of hitless ball. Styron started on the mound for the Blue Devils and worked five and two-thirds innings, being tagged

for five hits and six runs. Pactow was the starting hurler for the Devil Pups but the loss was charged to Dick Dube who relieved in the sixth.

Both teams scored two runs in their half of the first inning but the Devil Pups went out in front in the third with a single tally and then added another in the fourth before getting three in the top of the sixth.

Wielding the big bats for the Blue Devils were A. C. Davis, Braxton Piner and Curt Nelson. Davis blasted a bases empty homerun over the left-centerfield barrier as the leadoff hitter in the fourth inning and Piner delivered three hits in three times to bat. Nelson collected two hits in four trips, the last one being a 2-run single in the Blue Devils' six-inning uprising.

The homerun blast hit by Davis was the fifth roundtripper in four games for the Blue Devils.
