

# #7 Lee Hawkins Duke Baseball Games

## NON-ACCREDITED TITLE IS CAPTURED BY LOWELL

Chapel Hill, May 14.—Lowell high school, eastern title holders, won the state championship of non-accredited high schools here today, defeating the Colfax highs, western champions, 3 to 0.

The game started out to be a pitchers duel between Hawkins, of Lowell, and Marshall, of Colfax, neither side scoring until the fifth inning. In the fifth inning Lowell squeezed one run across for their first score. They also tallied once in each of the next two innings. Colfax threatened several times during the contest, loading the bases twice, but their batters failed to hit in the pinches and the men were left stranded on the bases. Lee Hawkins, for Lowell, struck out ten men and allowed only eight scattered hits.

The field was slow, due to the two-day rain of this week, so the fielding of both teams was ragged, with no feature plays. Colfax pulled the only double play of the game in the eighth, when G. Marshall had an infield roller and doubling Baker at second.

D. Atkins, with three singles, and I. Marshall, with two, led the Colfax attack; while G. Hawkins and Kimbro hit twice for the easterners.

## Duke Starts Season With 7 To 5 Win Over Visitors; Werber Secures Home Run

### Springfield Opens With Two Runs In First Inning And Adds Three More In Sixth —Captain Warren Starts Duke Rally

Getting their hits just at the times they were needed, Coach Jack Coombs' Blue Devils of Duke university opened their season on Hanes field yesterday afternoon by defeating the Springfield college team by the score of 7 to 5.

Springfield opened fast when three hits netted two runs in the initial inning.

A passed ball and an error in the Duke half of the first gave the Devils a run and the score was tied in the third stanza when Werber drove one far over the left field fence.

Captain Nick Warren then started a rally in the fifth with a two-bagger and when the Devils were halted the score stood 6 to 2 in their favor.

Springfield, after showing but little in the second, third, fourth and fifth innings pushed over three runs in the sixth to make the figures read 5-6. These tallies came from two hits off Belue coupled with the same number of errors. This was the final scoring of the "Y" college nine.

Another hit by Warren and a two-sack blow by Jenkins in the eighth gave the Devils their final marker, placing the score 7 to 5.

All the Duke pitchers looked good. Hawkins had great control and pitched good ball after the first inning upset. Belue gave up only three hits in three innings but was given poor support by his teammates. Jenkins, the final man to work, showed better than the other hurlers. He struck out three of the six batters who faced him and had the remainder getting pops or weak grounders.

2,000 fans braved the cold wind to see the game, which was played in weather that could not be called good baseball climate. The pitchers seemed to be slow in getting warmed up and slow fielding was the result of cold hands of the players.
