

# Smyrna Defeats Atlantic For Third Straight Win

Smyrna overtook a three-run deficit Tuesday afternoon at Atlantic and rolled on to a 10-4 victory over the Pirates for the Smyrna nine's third straight victory of the year.

Roy Styron, who hurled the first five innings for Smyrna was rewarded with his third victory of the campaign, with Mack O'Neal relieving in the sixth and seventh frames. Tom Salter went all the way for the Pirates to sustain his second loss in two games.

Atlantic opened the scoring in the bottom half of the first when they put together two hits, two walks, and an error by Smyrna's shortstop good for three runs.

## Atlantic Leads

After Smyrna had tallied a single run in the top of the second Atlantic retaliated with a single tally in the bottom of the third and enjoyed a 4-1 lead.

Smyrna tied the game in the top of the fourth on one hit, two walks, two errors by the Pirates, a wild pitch and a sacrifice fly.

The tie-breaking run was scored by Smyrna in the top of the fifth on a pair of base hits and a pair of walks.

The final scoring of the afternoon was done by Smyrna in the top of the seventh when they put together five hits and an error by the Pirates for five runs, which made the final score 10-4 in their favor.
