

Ben Wade Pitches 4-1 W Pride of Morehead City Holds Yanks to 1 Run for 6 Innings

Brooklyn.—(AP)—The Brooklyn Dodgers clinched their season series with the New York Yankees by beating the world champions for the fourth time in five games, 4-1, Saturday.

A chilled crowd of 8,409 saw Ben Wade of Morehead City, 29-year-old righthander, hold the Yankee to one run on four hits for six innings. The Red and Cub castoff saw his shut-out performance spoiled in the fifth when Jerry Coleman doubled and Allie Reynolds, his mound foe, singled.

Reynolds became the loser in the fifth when singles by Carl Furillo, Bob Morgan, Pee Wee Reese and Duke Snider, the latter driving in two runs with two out, accounted for three runs.
