

Local Mounders Won From Davis But Failed To Take Atlantic Game

Beaufort split its two games of the past week, losing to Atlantic at Atlantic Sunday 4 to 1 and winning from Davis here Monday, Labor Day 9 to 6. Lefty Kennel pitched four hit ball for Atlantic all coming off the bats of different hitters and fanned 13 while he and his mates were clubbing George Brooks for seven hits, including homers by himself, Brown and Babbitt. All the winners' runs were the result of circuit smashes. Beaufort's lone tally came in the eighth on hits by Clark and Willis.
