

Morehead High Boys' Teams Defeat Beaufort; Local Girls Lose 31-30

Last Tuesday was an exciting game day for Morehead High school students because three games were played with our old rival, Beaufort. At 2:30 the varsity boys played, at 7:30 the J.V.'s played, and at 8:30, the girls.

The boys' game was played before a capacity audience in the local gym and after what seemed ages, the Morehead Eagles came out the victor, 19-10. Our boys were leading at the end of the first quarter by a score of 3-1.

It was a very fast action game but slow on the scoring end, as you can see. Because of the good work of Beaufort's star forward, Piner, they were leading at the half, 8-5. Morehead took the lead and was on the high end of the following quarter scores: 8-4, 14-4, 22-5, 28-14. High scorer for Morehead was Burge with 7; second high was Bowers with 6. There was no high scorer for Beaufort as 6 boys made 2 points each and 2 boys made 1 each.

In the last game, the Morehead girls had to accept defeat as Beaufort came out the victor by one point. Three Morehead girls and two Beaufort girls fouled out with four personals each: DeElla Wade, Lena Willis and Mary Sue Tenny, Johnson and Chadwick. Both teams have good guards and because of them the ball was sent from one end to the other very fast. Morehead came out on the low end of the first quarter score and stayed there for the entire game.

Quarter scores were 4-2, 17-10, 21-19, 31-30, all for Beaufort. High scorer for Morehead was Elsie Willis with 5 field goals and one free shot, making 11 points. Second high honors went to DeElla Wade with 9. High for Beaufort was Guthrie with 3 field goals and 7 free shots, 13 points in all. Second high was Dickinson with 12 points, 1 field goal and 10 free shots.
