

East High Rolls Over Havelock 14-7 Friday

THE EAST CARTERET Mariners bombed Havelock 14-7 Friday on the Rams' home field. The victory ended Havelock hopes for the Northeastern Conference championship, while upping East's record to 8-7.

Coach John Hamilton reports

that the Mariners will play a final game today, a make-up bout at East against Roanoke Rapids.

Ronnie Fulcher, who relieved Dallas Arthur in the second inning, got the mound win for East. Together they struck out two, walked three and allowed nine hits.

VAUGHN STURM started for Havelock, but was relieved in the third by Allan Sanders, who got the loss. Sanders, too, was relieved, in the fifth, by Jimmy Nienstedt who finished the game. Together they struck out three, walked five, hit two batsmen and allowed 12 hits.

East scored three runs in the second frame on a single by Paul Damren, a hit batsman, a triple by Gary Lewis and a single by Glen Austin.

The Mariners got two more in the third on a single by Joel Hancock.

THE VISITING East squad got seven runs in the fourth, on four walks, singles by Jim Lewis and Hancock, and a home run over the center field fence by Gary Lewis.

East added one in the fifth on a single by Fulcher and a double by Jim Lewis; and got one more in the sixth on a walk, two errors and a single by Gary Lewis.

Coach Jim Parkin's Rams got four runs in the first inning on an East error and singles by Nienstedt, Don Zagorski, Sanders, McCarthy and Jim Muse. They added three runs in the third on a double by Jim Blisesi, two walks and a single by McCarthy.

EACH CLUB was charged with three errors in the game. East left three men stranded, while the Rams left four.

Gary Lewis led East batsmen with a triple, a homer and a single in three trips to the plate. Jim Lewis was three for five, two singles and a double.

McCarthy led the Rams with two singles in three times at bat. Nienstedt was two for four, both singles.
