<u>Jul 1, 1942</u> - The 1st 7 batters in the first inning score for Cleveland and the Tribe wins 7-2 over the host <u>White Sox</u>. Five hits, a walk and an error send <u>Orval Grove</u> to a quick shower. His replacement Jake Wade gives up an RBI single but only allows 2 hits the rest of the way. Al Smith is the winner. Smith will win 10 games this year, as will <u>Al Hollingsworth</u>, the top number of victories for a lefty in 1942.

<u>Dec 15, 1938</u> - The <u>Red Sox</u> send <u>Pinky Higgins</u> and P <u>Archie McKain</u> to the <u>Tigers</u> for pitchers <u>Elden Auker</u> and Jake Wade, and OF <u>Ed Morgan</u>. The Sox also ship OF <u>Ben Chapman</u> to the <u>Indians</u> in exchange for P <u>Denny Galehouse</u> and SS Tom Irwin.

<u>Oct 3, 1937</u> - Cleveland's <u>Johnny Allen</u>'s effort on 2 days rest to tie the AL record of 16 straight wins is frustrated when Detroit's Jake Wade beats him with a one-hit shutout 1-0 on the final day of the season. A two-out single by Hal Trosky in the 7th is Detroit's only hit. Detroit scores the only run in the 1st inning when a hot grounder gets by 3B <u>Sammy Hale</u> to drive in <u>Pete Fox</u> with the only run; Greenberg's RBI single is his 183rd of the year. A miffed Allen almost comes to blows with Hale after the game. Allen finishes with 14 complete games, a 15-1 mark, for an AL record winning percentage of .938.

<u>Aug 27, 1937</u> - The Red Sox down the 2nd-place Tigers, 8-5, behind the pitching of <u>Jack Wilson</u>. Jake Wade gives up six runs in the 7 innings for the loss. The Tigers get on the board first when <u>Rudy York</u> poles a three run homer-his 7th homer in 7 games-in a four-run first. The only other score for the Motormen is <u>Gee Walker</u>'s 5th inning homer. <u>Joe Cronin</u> and <u>Eric McNair</u> homer for Boston.
